A primary goal of a new Santa Clarita Valley Water District is equal representation for all local residents. Currently, some areas have more representation than others and many residents cannot vote for retail water officials. It's an oddity that needs fixing.

The new district levels the playing field by creating three evenly sized electoral divisions across the Valley, each with the same number of representatives. This gives all corners of the Valley an equal voice on water issues. Importantly, these "divisions" were crafted to meet State voting rights laws to help ensure fair representation for all populations.

It's a "neighbors electing neighbors" approach that represents good governance and a new era of water management for our region.
